## 12. FLEET SERVICES

- A. **Informational item regarding letter of intent to purchase New Way Sidewider XTR automated garbage truck from Amick Equipment in the amount of \$285,483.61.**

Mr. Williams stated the city can purchase this new truck for \$285,000 with the letter of intent. He stated it is budged for \$350,000 so if we bought this truck it would save the city over \$60,000. He said if the city does nothing, the truck will cost \$367,000. Mr. Williams said the lead time is about one year but if we commit to it now the price is locked in for \$285,000. Council Member Smalls asked if trees will need to be cut to accommodate this new truck. Mr. Williams confirmed if trash cans are placed out correctly, the trees will not be in the way of the garbage truck. Council Member Clements stated the trash pickup on Front Street leaves a mess and requested the city look at other options. He said he sent a couple of options to Dr. Yúdice to research.

**15. CITY ADMINISTRATOR REPORT**

Dr. Yúdice said they had a meeting with the Georgetown County Water and Sewer District to discuss streamlining the process for the proposed subdivision south of Maryville. She said when all the phases are completed, the subdivision will be served by the city and district's utilities. She stated they agreed on developing a Memorandum of Understanding that will help the developer with a streamlined process. Dr. Yúdice confirmed signs have been placed at East Bay boat launch parking lot. Dr. Yúdice stated she will present the board and commissions policy at the upcoming August 25th workshop. She said she emailed a draft policy and procedure document to Council and Council will need to adopt the document as a policy after making any revisions to the respective boards and commissions ordinances. Dr. Yúdice said in October 2021, MASC approved a hometown economic development grant to the city to install a temporary multi-purpose outdoor marketplace and park at the old city hall site. She said with Council authorizing the sale of the property, we requested MASC to consider revising the project to install commercial grade porch-style swings at the city parks on Front Street and replace the wooden planters with concrete ones on the Front Street sidewalks. She said this will improve the experience of our visitors, especially with the opening of The George Hotel in fall 2023. She stated the concrete planters will reduce costs of replacing them every few years.

Council Member Clements requested an update of the dilapidated housing demolition that has to be completed by the end of the year. Dr. Yúdice stated we are still going through the procurement process for the asbestos assessment. She said the paperwork has been submitted to the state and we are waiting for the state to award the contract. Council Member Clements requested a timeline for completion of the entire project. Discussions followed.

Council Member Clements said Mayor Jayroe and himself met with Georgetown County Council Member, Lillie Jean Johnson regarding a new park at the Howard Center. He said he discussed it with Mr. Keith Price at Georgetown County Schools and he is excited about the project and stated he could speak with the School Board. Council Member Clements said it would be a joint project between the school district, the county, and the city. He said there is no financial commitment needed from the city.

Council Member Milton stated for the record "The way it went down just now, that wasn't supposed to happen. They made that decision after we walked out that door, because when we leave out that back the decision was made that Donald Gilliard would be reappointed. They had their little private meeting, it had to be two minutes after we walked out of there. If you notice how she did this just now, she didn't have any no votes against Don Gilliard." Council Member Milton said for the record "that decision was made, you can say what you want to say. That decision was made two minutes after we walked out of that room because that was not the decision we made in the back so that is why I said it, like it or not like it that's the truth."

**22. PUBLIC COMMENTS ON CITY SERVICES, BUSINESS, OR OTHER CITY MATTERS NOT ON THE AGENDA**

Mayor Jayroe recognized Mr. Wesley Gibson. Mr. Gibson said it is a shame and disrespectful to the citizens of Georgetown to wait until 9:00pm to let Mayor and Council know our concerns. He said it is a shame if someone doesn't agree with this Council, they are kicked off the board. Mr. Gibson said there are twenty sections of the city but everything he heard about tonight is Front Street. He said there are other areas in the city that needs attention besides Front Street. He stated he has worked with council before but he is upset because he thought Council was for all of Georgetown, not just Front Street.

Mr. Gibson said he is not happy with electric bills being raised and people can't eat. He said he was disappointed in the decision about Donald Gilliard not getting reappointment. Mr. Gibson requested public speaking be moved back to the front of the meeting because you work for us.

Mayor Jayroe recognized Ms. Janette Graham. Ms. Graham questioned why there has to be a 40% utility increase. She stated the approved budget and American Rescue Plan funds has enough money floating around Council. She said she agrees with Mr. Gibson and requested the public comments should be moved back to the

front of the agenda. She said you are not for all of Georgetown, you are only for yourselves.

Mayor Jayroe recognized Mr. James Sanderson. Mr. Sanderson said he is disappointed in the action Council took on the appointment of Donald Gilliard. He said the Board of Zoning Appeals voted 6-1 based on facts and evidence. Mr. Sanderson said Mr. Gilliard did not do anything to prevent him from serving on the board. He said he takes pride in serving as the union president at the steel mill because he is upfront, bold, and honest and he can't say that about Council.
